988: A Lifeline for Mental Health Support:

To address this crisis, PortaPros is actively participating in Construction Suicide Prevention Week and beyond. We're taking a simple yet effective step — working with the Idaho Associated General Contractors Association (IDAGC) in placing informational stickers in over 1500 PortaPros portable restrooms throughout the Treasure Valley area. These stickers provide valuable resources available through Idahocrisis.org and a dedicated suicide hotline, 988, for those who need someone to talk to.

988 offers 24/7 access to trained crisis counselors who can provide vital support to individuals experiencing mental health-related distress.

- Share bold messages about our commitment to mental health wellness and suicide prevention.
- Equip our workforce with the knowledge to identify warning signs.
- Nurture internal champions.

Ten Practical Steps for Construction Leaders:

PortaPros encourages construction leaders to proactively address this issue with these ten actionable steps:

- 1. Make a commitment within your leadership team to address this issue head-on.
- 2. Educate yourself and your team about mental health issues, suicide prevention, and addiction recovery.
- 3. Familiarize yourself with the behavioral health services available in your health plan.
- 4. Ensure that your employees are aware of available resources through your company's Employee Assistance Program (EAP).
- 5. Connect with local mental health and suicide-prevention organizations to provide training and resources.
- 6. Display suicide-prevention posters in areas where employees gather.

- 7. Conduct companywide safety stand-downs to discuss sensitivity, acceptance, and available resources.
- 8. Share refrigerator magnets and wallet cards with essential contact information for resources.
- 9. Incorporate discussions about mental health and suicide prevention into your company's new-hire orientation process.
- 10. Encourage supervisors to hold periodic toolbox talks on mental health, suicide prevention, and addiction recovery.
